Pinterest is a free social media tool that functions as a virtual pinboard. Users can organize and share images, media, and web content through themed pinboards based on personal interests, hobbies, and events.

#### **Common terminology:** (Source: http://pinterest.com/about/help/)

**Pin:** A pin is an image added to Pinterest. A pin can be added from a website using the Pin It button, or you can upload images from your computer. Each pin added using the Pin It button links back to the site it came from.

**Repin:** A repin is adding an image you find while browsing Pinterest to your own board. **Board:** A board is a set of pins. A board can be created on any topic, such as Cool Posters, Recipes For Dinner, or Wishlist.

**Following:** "Following" someone means you'll see that person's pins shown to you in realtime on Pinterest.
