### Sources for News on E-books and E-Readers:

**Media Bistro** (<http://www.mediabistro.com/appnewser/category/ebook-news>): Plenty of wonky news, and news you can use. All articles come from a variety of sources, so be sure you are comfortable with who, what, when and why when you evaluate the information.

**Reader Rocket** (<http://readerrocket.com/>): a site designed to compare e-readers to aid you in making a purchase decision. Updated regularly, this is a good addition to the previous handout.

**Digital Book World** (<http://www.digitalbookworld.com>): covers the business end of the industry and specifically how it relates to authors and libraries. Very good breaking news coverage. Sign-up for the daily e-mail blast to get all the headlines you will need to stay on-top of news in the e-book/e-reader world.

**Forbes** (<http://www.forbes.com>): Forbes has a number of articles covering the business side of e-books and e-readers. These articles often include opinion pieces about the interaction between libraries and the business side of the industry. This is more hit or miss for finding new information, but it is worth checking out from time to time.

**The Big 6 – ebooks in libraries** (<https://www.facebook.com/thebig6ebooks>): This Facebook page provides information, news, and commentary on who is and is not selling to libraries and other publishing developments for e-books.

**Overdrive** (<http://www.overdrive.com/>): Easily overlooked, the Overdrive blog is your BEST source for news about and changes to the largest e-book platform used in libraries today. This is a must read for anyone providing e-book training to library patrons.
