Social Media: Why?

Networks -- of information and people -- are diffuse.

Social media brings them closer together.

Social Media: Why?

- Connects people with people (customers, colleagues, vendors, friends) far away;
- Lets your people connect with others' people;
- Provides an opportunity to talk, (but it's more important to *listen*).

How To Run A Great FB Page (An Incomplete List)

- Pages are for organizations,
 Accounts are for people
- Distribute Page Administrator responsibilities (but not too widely!)
- Choose great profile & cover photos
- Develop a clear, warm voice

How to Run a Great FB Page (An Incomplete List)

- Post frequently
- Use a mix of content
- Sign your posts
- Like, Comment & Share
- Listen to your fans (and critics)!


