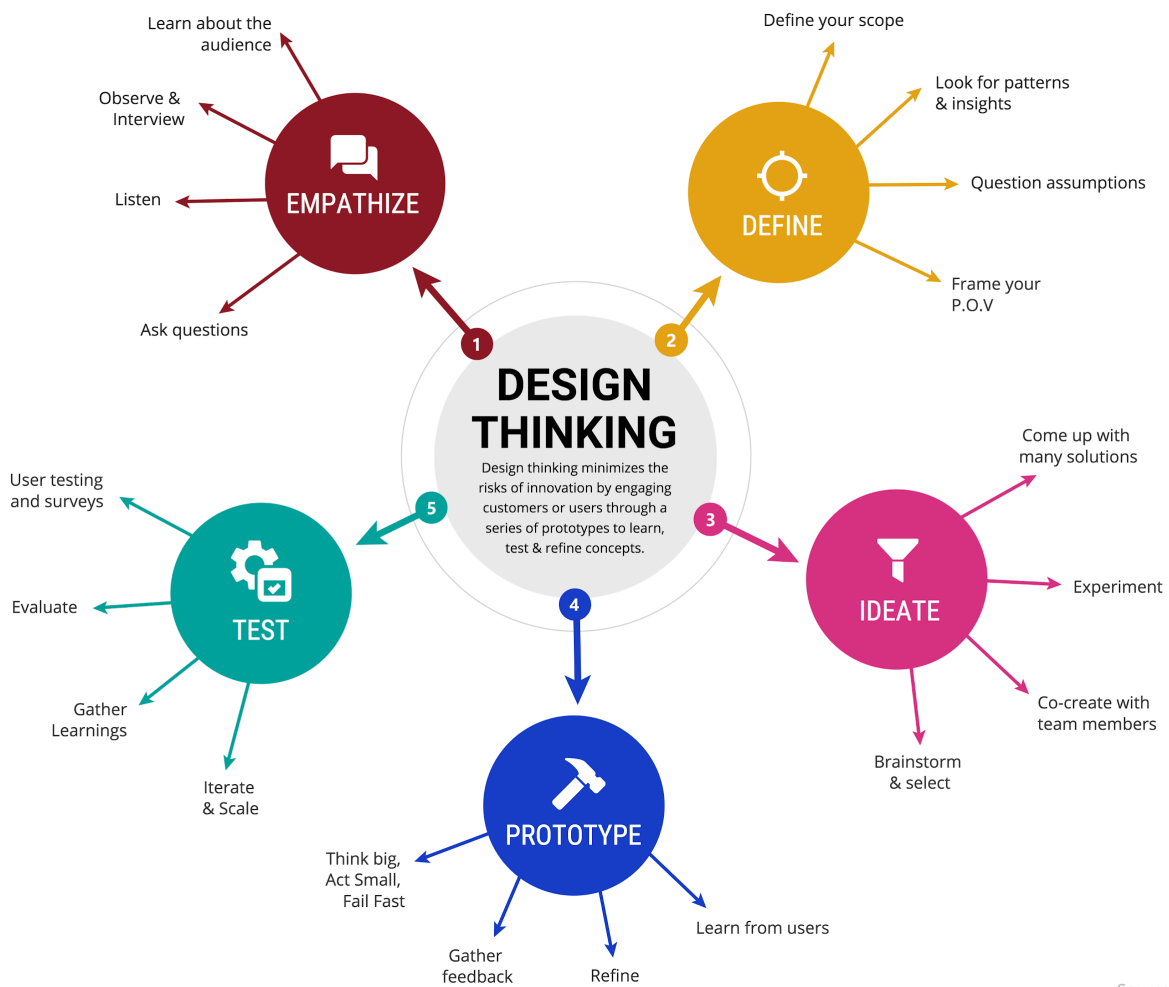


One thing I learned today that I'd like to take with me:
