- Children's Reference Questions
 - Undelineated and unfocused
 - "I want to know about animals."
 - Extremely specific
 - "I need to know a recipe for food that was served at the first Thanksgiving."
 - Limited as to which type of materials can be used
 - No INTERNET
 - Must have a book today

- Who made it?
 - Credibility
- When was it last updated?
- Does the website cite its sources?
- □ Are there a lot of ads?
- Are there obvious biases?
- Is it easy to find the information you need?

- □ I need a New Jersey folktale that is not too scary.
- I need a Native American recipe.
- What is the heart rate of a hibernating woodchuck?


Even More!

- How many miles is it to the moon?
- I need information on gems (and there are no books left on the shelf).
- What was the largest volcano eruption in the 20th Century?
- I need to do a science project and I have no idea what to do!
- In what website(s) would I look to find the genealogy of my family?
- I need a biography on Orel Hershiser. I know he played for the Cleveland Indians.

To Wiki or not to Wiki (pedia that is)

- Wikipedia is enormous; Currently it has over 15 million articles in 250 languages.
- □ It is the 6th most visited website in the world.¹
- Wikipedia is free content which means they can be reproduced by anyone without permission.
- Anyone can write and post or edit most articles.
- Large number of studies most notably, one in the journal Nature, showing that accuracy of information on Wikipedia is as good as or better than such sources as the Encyclopedia Britannica.²
