


Conch Shell Spinner Instructions

#### **Embossed Tin Ornaments**

- Instructions
- Mechanical pencils and regular pencils work great on metal.
- Each participant worked on top of a felt square to allow for deeper embossing.
- We began on a practice piece of heavyweight Reynolds Wrap Foil.
- I gave everyone two 4"x 4"squares of metal and 6 simple 4X4" designs to copy.

- Finished ornament could be mounted on felt for more strength or even framed.

## **Eggshell Mosaics**

- Instructions
- I provided rectangular bases that I made from 2 layers for thin cardboard glued together and then cut out and painted black for a nice stained glass window effect. Each had a hole punched out for hanging.
- Brush on Mod Podge or regular tacky glue, crack the eggshell onto it. Fill all areas letting the shell run off the edges.
- Move shell around with pins or toothpicks til you're happy with the arrangement.
- Once dry snip off evenly with scissors.
- Drops of alcohol ink mix nicely on top.
- When dry, brush on Glossy Accents or Mod Podge Dimensional Magic.

## Intro to Alcohol Ink Painting

#### Instructions

- Alcohol and ink will mix on the surface of nonporous surfaces when you drip the alcohol with plastic droppers.
- I suggest you work on Yupo paper or Grafix Durabright paper or even crunched up tin foil.
- Play around with blowing techniquesstraws or hair dryers (on cool setting) work.
- Krylon UV resistant varnish will protect finished work.
- We made bookmarks and punched out pendants with our practice sheets.

#### **Paper Feather Pens**

#### Instructions

- Use book pages of your choice (I used Harry Potter) or printed pictures of feathers found on line.
- Cut out using a basic feather shape.
- Cut the wire to fit your feather.
- Poke and glue the wire securely into the end of the pen barrel and glue feather shape over it letting the pen stick out the bottom.
- Cover the pen barrel by winding ¼" strip of paper from the tip of pen to the end of it.
- Slice length of feather with scissors to emulate a real feather.

- Instructions
- Mine were 5 inch hearts for Galentine's Day, but you could do any simple shape
- Each was ½ a fat quarter of quilting cotton and 2 pounds of rice
- The sewing doesn't need to be super pretty, but the stitches need to be small enough to keep the rice in
- I still use mine!

- I cut out paper templates for the different pieces, and had patrons cut the felt and decorate with sharpies
- A sturdy needle threader is really helpful for folks with dexterity issues <u>like this</u>

#### Bottle cap snowman magnet (or ornament)

- Gave patrons paper, sharpies, ribbon, felt, and buttons to create faces and accessories.
- Used hot glue guns.
- Gave patons a magnet to glue on the back if they preferred that to using ribbon to make an ornament.

- Patrons left their creations with us for display in our case for a few months. I emailed them when they were ready to be picked up. This would work as a take and make easily, but I would assume some of them wouldn't come back for display so I liked doing it as an in-person program.

## SCARECROW WINE BOTTLE CRAFT

SuppliesClear Wine bottleBurlapRaffiaAcrylic paints and/or markersEmbellishments for decoratingglue gunWine Bottle lights with cork (optional)

Stuff the bottle with the Wine Bottle lights, then add the raffia. You can add more or less ( to your liking) Use a strip of the burlap and wrap it around the lower part of the bottle, using a glue gun, pleat it as you go. Take another strip of burlap and wrap it around the top of the bottle covering the cork. Decorate with embellishments Paint or draw the face

## Dried Flower Votive/Tealight Candle Holders

Glass jar

Dried flowers (Purchase or dry your own)

Mod Podge

Twine or Ribbon



Tea light

Using a brush, paint a section of the jar with Mod Podge Place the dried flowers on the jar and then carefully paint more Mod Podge on top. Do the same for the rest of the jar.

Once dry add twine or ribbon to finish and add tea light

# Mason Jar Fairy Lights

#### **Supplies Needed:**

- Mason Jars (Smooth sided)
- Mod Podge
- Foam brushes
- Pressed flowers
- String of Fairy Lights
- Hot Glue

#### Method

- Affix the pressed flowers to the jar and use Mod Podge to set them . If they are larger flowers, you may need to hold them for a moment or two so they stick.
- Flowers can be placed in any arrangement on the outside of them Mason Jar.
- Once the flowers are attached, paint a layer of Mod Podge over the entire jar. Using a heat gun, dry it and apply a second coat.
- Attach the Fairy Lights to the bottom of the lid using a bit of hot glue.



# **Ribbon Wreaths**

#### **Supplies Need**

- 6" or 8" styrofoam wreaths
- Assorted ribbons
- Assorted Greenery
- Assorted wooden shapes
- Hot Glue Guns and Glue

#### Method

- Wrap ribbons around wreath overlapping to cover entire wreath.
- Secure with hot glue intermittently
- Attach ribbons, greenery, and wooden cut outs.

# Halloween Fabric Frames

#### **Supplies Needed**

- 6" Wooden Embroidery Hoops
- 6" Cake Boards or cardboard cut to fit
- Halloween/Fall themed fabric Fat Quarters
- Wooden Decorations
- Assorted Ribbon
- Hot Glue Guns and Glue

#### Method

- Using the cake board as a template, trace a circle onto the fabric and cut to a circle a little bigger than 6"
- Secure fabric in frame and trim excess.
- Put cake board behind fabric to act as base. Can secure with a drop or two of hot glue
- Attach ribbons and wood shapes to fabric with hot glue



# Glass Etching

#### **Supplies Needed**

- Glass object of your choosing (not Pyrex)
- Protective gloves
- Pain brushes
- Adhesive stencils (or make your own on a Cricut)
- Armour Etch glass etching cream
- Sink with running water

#### Method

- Apply your stencil to your glass; be sure that all edges are firmly pressed down
- Wearing gloves, spread Armour Etch liberally over the desired design with a paint brush
- Wait several minute (follow instructions on etching cream bottle)
- Rinse away etching cream, then peel away stencil to reveal final design

\*\*\*Etching cream can cause serious chemical burns; gloves are very important!\*\*\*\*
